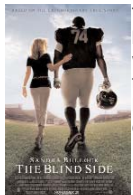

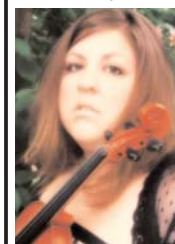
Part of the Town of Oyster Bay Distinguished Artist Series. The Isotope Stompers are an exhilarating seven-

A Letter From The Director: Debbie Podolski



The Library budget vote and trustee election will be held on Tuesday, April 6 from 7:30 AM - 9 PM on the lower level of the Farmingdale Public Library. This year's budget reflects an increase in the tax levy of 0.74%. The modest increase is needed for the anticipated reduction in state aid and grants. The library recently upgraded to a 10 MB circuit to increase the bandwidth for Internet access which will increase our monthly telecommunication costs. Copies of the detailed budget are available on our website and at the Reference Desk.

As a member the Nassau Library System (NLS), the Library is able to be cost-efficient in many ways. We participate in coordinated purchasing through NLS of electronic databases which allows us to obtain more content for less cost. We are also part of the integrated circulation system consortium which is managed by ALIS and operates from the NLS facility. The online catalog allows patrons to search the holdings of all of the Nassau County public libraries. The NLS delivery service fills your requests for materials from other libraries and delivers them directly to your home library. Through NLS and ALIS, your library has been able to provide services through the use of technology. The Farmingdale Public Library has been chosen as a pilot library to implement self-check service using RFID to make checking out materials easier, private, and faster.

Library Taxes

Taxing jurisdictions, such as the library district, establish a budget which is voted on by residents in the district. A warrant is sent to the Receiver of Taxes attesting to the dollar amount that is to be levied against taxable properties. The Nassau County Department of Assessment calculates the tax rate for homeowners based on this information.

Your library taxes are based on the assessed value of your property multiplied by the library tax rate. All single-family houses in the Farmingdale Library District currently have a library tax rate of 19.681

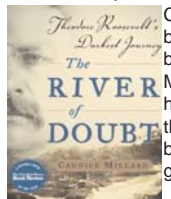

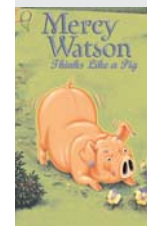
